Ramon Louis Baylor was born September 12, 1938, to the late Herman M. Baylor and Geraldine M. Baylor in Washington, DC. Ramon was one of five children, all whom preceded him in death. In the year 2003, Ramon gave his life to the Lord at Allen Chapel A.M.E. Church under the leadership of Pastor Leon Lipscombe.

Ramon graduated from Cardoza Senior High School in 1956. After graduation, Ramon began working at the Government Printing Office (GPO) in 1957. During that time, Ramon enlisted in the United States Army and was honorably discharged in 1962. Ramon retired after a successful career as Foreman in the Bindery Division of the Government Printing Office (GPO) in 1994.
